

MAHARSHI DAYANAND UNIVERSITY, ROHTAK

Situated at a distance of 70 KM North-West of Delhi on the National Highway No. 10 Maharshi Dayanand University is spread over a sprawling 733 acres of land on the outskirts of the historic city of Rohtak.

The University has 31 Post-Graduate departments under 14 faculties with more than 350 faculty members; one Post-Graduate Regional Centre at Rewari; one Institute of Law and Management at Gurgaon; one maintained University College; one Directorate of Distance Education; one University Centre for Competitive Examinations and one Computer Centre and one Institute of Hotel & Tourism Management at M.D.U. Rohtak, Besides 223 affiliated colleges offering courses in Humanities, Physical Sciences, Social Sciences, Commerce, Management and Computers. Pt. B.D. Sharma Post-Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak and Govt. Dental College, Rohtak, Maharaja Aggarsain Medical Institute, Agroha; Y.M.C.A. Institute of Engineering, Faridabad and TITS, Bhiwani are among the premier affiliated institutions which form the nucleus of University's diverse academic programmes.

Apart from running LLM, LL.B. 3 Year courses, the Faculty of Law has been the pioneer in introducing 5-Year Integrated Course of Law in 1983, which has been subsequently followed by various Universities of the country. Since its inception, the faculty has earned distinction in the teaching, extra curricular activities and extension services. Under the legal aid programme, hundreds of legal aid camps and workshops have been organised in remote areas of the State. In addition to traditional Post-Graduate courses, the University is already running the courses of Journalism and Mass Communication, and Defence & Strategic Studies.

The University has also extended its campus to Gurgaon and started the Institute of Law & Management. The College is housed in a beautifully designed building sprawled over an area of 10 acres of land in Sector-40, Gurgaon. In the first phase, the College has started Five-Year Integrated Law Course with an intake of 120 students, but in the coming years, the Institute will impart specialized legal education in the area of International Trade Law, Corporate Law, Intellectual Property Rights and Trademarks Law.

Keeping in view the spirit of Open University System and in accordance with the National Policy of Education, which lays emphasis on Continuing and Distance Education, Maharshi Dayanand University is running various under-graduate and post-graduate courses through correspondence since 1988. For the purpose of providing quality education and to make the courses comparable at national and international level, the status of Directorate of Correspondence Courses was upgraded to Directorate of Distance Education.

Encouraged by the successful implementation and completion of B.Ed. and other programmes for the last many years, the University has visualised the importance of professional education and from the academic session 2000-2001 the Directorate has offered Masters degree in Global Business Management, Master of Laws and P.G. Diploma in Labour Laws. From January 2001, the Directorate

has also introduced a number of computer courses like two-year MCA, M.Sc. (Computer Science), Three years BCA programme, one year APGDIT programme and one year APGDCA.

The University has a separate Centre for Competitive Examinations which provides comprehensive coaching and counselling services to the students appearing for various National and State level competitive examinations. It imparts subsidised coaching and facilities to the students belonging to SC/ST, Backward Classes and minority communities. Some of the main examinations for which the Centre provides coaching include Civil Services, Bank Probationary Officers, UGC Test for JRF and Lecturership, CDS and NDA. The Centre is launching a regular programme for the development of communication skills of the students both in English and Hindi with a view to make them competitive for all categories of jobs.

The University teachers have been regularly publishing research papers in prestigious national/international journals and magazines. They have generated a large number of books in various disciplines. The fact that more than 1000 research scholars have been awarded Ph.D degree in various disciplines since 1998 speaks of the volume of research work being done in the University.

The Library in University campus forms the nucleus of all academic activities. The University Library offers excellent facilities with a seating capacity for 650 readers at a time and 24 cubicles for University teachers and researchers. Equipped with nearly 2.5 lac documents, 600 Indian and foreign journals, 3 reading halls, 2 seminar halls, a spacious committee room, it is the hub of all academic activities. In the process of modernising, the functioning of the library is being computerised. Various services like bibliographic services, reprographic services, inter-library loan facilities, Xerox facility, E-mail/internet facilities are made available to the users of the library.

In addition to beautiful playgrounds and massive sports infrastructure, a major attraction on the Campus is the Swimming Pool of national standard. In sports, students have achieved commendable positions in various games at the national level.

The University has set up a special SC/ST Cell for the upliftment of all reserved category students. The Cell is making earnest efforts for effective implementation of the policies and programmes relating to appointments, promotions and admissions for the benefit of reserved category students. All the policies and programmes of the UGC/Govt. of India/State Govt. received from time to time are fully implemented and related information is displayed at prominent places to help the reserved category candidates.

KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY, KURUKSHETRA

Kurukshetra University was established in 1956 as a Unitary Teaching and Residential University. Initially starting with the Department of Sanskrit, it has grown into the a multi-faculty University, teaching various subjects in the Faculties of Arts and Languages; Science; Social Science; Indic studies; Education; Engineering and technology; Law; Commerce and Management; Ayurvedic Medicine; Medical and Dental Sciences. From 30th June 1974, the character of the University changed into an affiliating one, with the admission of all the colleges in State of Haryana to the privilege of University. The colleges at Rohtak were withdrawn from this University in May, 1976 and affiliated to Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak. Subsequently with effect from 8th November, 1978 the remaining colleges of District Rohtak and the Colleges in the Districts of Bhiwani, Gurgaon, Mohindergarh, Sonapat were also withdrawn and affiliated to Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak. At present the University consists of 10 Faculties comprising of 40 Teaching Departments and 125 affiliated colleges situated in the Districts Ambala, Panipat, Kaithal, Yamuna Nagar, Hisar, Jind, Karnal, Sirsa, Kurukshetra, Panchkula and Fatehabad.

The campus of the University sprawling across 400 acres of land against an idyllic background of rural charm is situated at a distance of 4 kms. from the Kurukshetra Railway Station. The site near the sacred tank of Kurukshetra was chosen by the sponsors of the University for its historical and spiritual significance.

Railway and Road Connections

Kurukshetra Railway Station is almost midway between Karnal and Ambala on the Delhi-Ambala section of Northern Railway. All major Express and Mail trains halt at this station. Convenient direct bus service is available from Amritsar, Delhi, Haridwar, Chandigarh, Ambala and most of the other towns in Haryana.

Facilities

The University is endowed with a beautiful and well-maintained campus with spacious playgrounds, centrally air-conditioned auditorium, sprawling rose garden, gymnasium and swimming pool etc.

Adequate and well furnished hostel facilities exist for male as well as female students. There is an excellent sturcture for sports, cultural and recreation activities. There is a specious and well-equipped Central Library having more than three lac books and periodicals on its shelves. All students are entitled to medical facilities provided in University Health Centre.

Note:

- 1. Admission process shall be completed by 30th September, 2007**
- 2 Centre once allotted shall not be allowed to be changed.**

The Centre in which a candidate is to appear will be indicated on the 'Admit Card' to be issued to the candidates. No candidate will be admitted to the Examination Hall, unless he/she produces the 'Admit Card'. The counselling schedule will be notified by the Director, PGIMS, Rohtak .

IMPORTANT NOTE :

All the candidates, who apply for MBBS/BDS/BAMS Entrance Examination - 2007, will be allowed provisionally to appear in the Entrance Examination. Admission shall be subject to eligibility/verification of documents/certificates etc. at the time of Counselling.

Provisional Admission to Entrance Examination

A candidate whose result of the qualifying Examination has not been announced by the date fixed for the Entrance Examination can also apply and appear in the examination provisionally. However, he/she will have to produce proof of his/her having passed the examination on the basis of which he/she claims eligibility to appear in the entrance examination by the date of the Counselling to be held for final selection of the candidates. A candidate who fails to produce the original certificates, marks-sheets and other certificates on the basis of which he/she is claiming to be eligible for admission to the course even at the time of Counselling shall not be considered for admission even if he/she has been placed in the merit list.

The candidate who has not passed his qualifying examination in full on the date of first counselling shall not be eligible.

AFFILIATED GOVT./GOVT. AIDED MEDICAL/DENTAL COLLEGES IN HARYANA

At present, the following Medical/Dental Colleges are affiliated to various Universities in Haryana. The number of tentative seats in each College have been indicted in Chapter-IV of the Prospectus. The number of Colleges and seats are subject to verification and this shall be announced through newspapers before counselling.

Medical Colleges

- 1. Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak**
An affiliated Institute of M.D. University, Rohtak provides facilities for MBBS, MD, MS and various Post-graduate Diploma Courses.
- 2. Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Medical Research and Education, Agroha (Hisar)**
An affiliated Institute of M.D. University, Rohtak provides facilities for MBBS Course.

Dental Colleges

- 3. Govt. Dental College, Rohtak**
An affiliated College of M.D. University, Rohtak provides facilities for BDS and MDS Courses.

AFFILIATED GOVT./GOVT. AIDED AYURVEDIC COLLEGE IN HARYANA

- 6. Shri Krishana Govt. Ayurvedic College, Kurukshetra**
(An affiliated College of Kurukshetra University provides facilities for BAMS Course).

CHAPTER-II
ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

A. Indian Citizen of any of the following categories will be eligible to appear in the MBBS/BDS Entrance Examination:

- i) The candidates, who are bonafide residents of Haryana as per instructions issued by the Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana Chandigarh vide letter no. 62/17/95-6 GS1 dated 3.10.96 (Appendix -C) and submit relevant certificate of bonafide residents as laid down in letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30-1-2004 (Appendix-D).
- ii) The children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of the employees of Indian Defence Services/para-Military Forces belonging to Haryana State at the time of entry into service as per their service record. (Such candidates will submit a certificate in the proforma given in Appendix 'E' from the Officer duly authorised by the Army/ Navy/Air Force/concerned Para-military Forces Headquarters, as the case may be).
- iii) The children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of Ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/para-Military Forces belonging to Haryana State at the time of entry into service as per their service record who retired from service on or after first April of the preceding year of admission. (Such candidates will submit a certificate in the proforma given in Appendix 'M' from the Officer duly authorised by the Army/ Navy/Air Force/concerned Para-military Forces Headquarters, as the case may be).
- iv) The children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of Ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/para-Military Forces belonging to Haryana State at the time of entry into service as per their service record, provided the candidate has studied 10+2 class as a regular candidate in a recognised institution in Haryana. (Such candidates will submit a certificate in the proforma given in Appendix 'M' from the Officer duly authorised by the Army/Navy/Air Force/concerned Para-military Forces Headquarters, as the case may be and also a certificate to the effect that he has studied 10+2 class as a regular candidate in a recognised institution in Haryana from the Principal/Head of the Institution last attended in the proforma given in Appendix 'B').

B. The candidates belonging to one of the categories mentioned above should also fulfil the following minimum conditions to appear in the Entrance Examination:-

MBBS/BDS

- i) He/She will attain the age of 17 years or more on 31-12-2007.

Note: The age shall be determined as per entry in the Matriculation/Higher Secondary or its Equivalent Certificate:

- ii) The candidate must have passed both the following examinations:-
- a) Senior School Certificate Examination (10+2) of Board of School Education Haryana or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto with atleast 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together and must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually in qualifying examination.
 - b) The candidate must have come in the merit list prepared as a result of the Competitive Entrance Examination by securing not less than 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together in the Competitive Examination.

Note:

1. In respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Class the marks obtained be read as 40% instead of 50% (both at qualifying and competitive examinations).
2. The candidates passing qualifying examination from National Open School shall be eligible provided they fulfil the conditions laid down at ii (a).
3. The conditions at 'A' above will not be applicable in case of nominees of Govt. of India.
4. Diploma in Pharmacy and Dressor's Course are not equivalent to 10+2 for the purpose of admission to MBBS/BDS courses according to the rules of M.D. University and Kurukshetra University.
5. The list of the examinations recognised as equivalent to 10+2 examinations of Board of School Education, Haryana is available in the Academic Branch of the University. The list of the recognised examinations available with the University may be consulted before making admission to the course.

BAMS

The eligibility conditions meant for MBBS/BDS as given above from A to B(i) and note of B(i) shall apply. Remaining eligibility conditions for BAMS are as under:

- ii) The candidate must have:
- a) Passed Senior Secondary Examination (12th Class) of the Board of School Education, Haryana or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto with at least 33% marks in each subject i.e. English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany-Zoology) in the theory and practical separately and 50% marks in aggregate of these subjects and pass in Sanskrit as an elective core subject of at least 100 marks.

OR

Uttar Madhyama of Sampurnanand Sanskrit, Vishwavidyala, Varanasi with Science (Biology Group) and English.

OR

Any other examination recognised by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra/ M.D. University, Rohtak as equivalent to (a) or (b) above with the prescribed percentage of marks/subjects, as the case may be .

AND

- b) must have been placed in the merit list prepared as a result of the Competitive Entrance Examinations for Admission to BAMS Course

- Note:-
1. The candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Tribes/Backward Class will be required to secure minimum pass marks instead of 50% in aggregate in English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany-Zoology) in any one of the Examinations mentioned at (a) above.
 2. A candidate who has taken admission in BAMS and has not passed Sanskrit at 10+2 level prior to admission in BAMS, shall have to offer Sanskrit in BAMS Ist Prof. Examination.
 3. The subject of English of 10+2 or equivalent examination may be accepted for the purpose irrespective of marks assigned to it.
 4. The candidates passing qualifying examination from National Open School are also eligible provided they fulfil the eligibility conditions laid down as above.
 5. Diploma in Pharmacy & Dressor's course are not equivalent to 10+2 for the purpose of admission to BAMS Course according to the rules of M.D. University, Rohtak/ Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
 6. The list of the examinations recognised as equivalent to 10+2 examinations of Board of School Education, Haryana is available in the Academic Branch of the University. The list of the recognised examinations available with the University may be consulted before making admission to the course.

CHAPTER-III
SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

1. a) **Date of Entrance Examination** : 10-06-2007 (Sunday)
b) **Timings** : 2.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m.

2. **Medium of Examination**

The medium of Entrance Examination will be English.

The question-paper will be set in English.

3. **Scheme of Examination**

The Entrance Examination shall consist of one paper of three hours duration.

The paper will include objective type questions (45 for each subject) covering the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.

4. **Number of Questions and Maximum Marks**

- (i) There will be a total of 180 objective type questions (45 for each subject of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology).
- (ii) The paper shall carry a maximum of 720 marks.
- (iii) Only objective type questions will be included in the Entrance Examination.

5. **Negative Marking**

For each correct response, the candidate will get full credit . Each incorrect response will be negatively marked and the candidate will get one-fourth discredit for it. For example, where one correct response/answer is awarded four marks then in case of an incorrect/wrong answer the candidate will be awarded minus one mark.

6. **Instructions For Question Booklet**

- i) Candidates will be given a Question Booklet and Answer Sheet immediately after taking seat. They are advised to read and follow the instructions on front and back-page of the question Booklet carefully.
- ii) There is Question Booklet number and code (A or B or C or D) mentioned on the front page, which every candidate must carefully fill in the appropriate place on the Answer Sheet.
- iii) Candidate must sign on the front page of the Question Booklet at the appropriate place marked for this purpose.
- iv) The Question Booklet has paper seal pasted on it. Candidates should break the seal and open the Question Booklet only when they are asked to do so by the Invigilator.
- v) Candidate must check that Question Booklet has 180 questions (45 in Botany, 45 in Zoology, 45 in Physics and 45 in Chemistry) immediately after breaking the seal. In case any defect in the Question Booklet is found, Invigilator may be requested to change the same immediately.

- vi) The Question Booklet and the Answer Sheet must be returned to the Invigilator before leaving the Hall at 5.00 p.m.
- vii) The candidate shall indicate the number of questions attempted in each section.

7. Instructions For Answer Sheet

- i) A dummy sample of the Answer Sheet is available in this Prospectus.
- ii) Use good quality ball pen strictly as directed on the Answer Sheet.
- iii) Do not fold or put any stray mark, nor do any rough work on the Answer Sheet.
- iv) Fill in the Roll No. and Question Booklet No. and Booklet Code printed on front page of the Question Booklet in the proper blocks as directed on the Answer Sheet.
- v) Sign at the appropriate place on the Answer Sheet with Ball pen.

8. Rough Work

The candidate should not do any rough work on the Answer-sheet. All rough work is to be done on the last page of Test Booklet. Do not mark or write anything elsewhere in the Test Booklet.

9. Procedure to be followed in the Examination Hall

- i) 10 minutes before the commencement of the examination each candidate will be given a sealed Test Booklet with an answer-sheet placed inside it.
- ii) Immediately on receipt of the Test Booklet the candidate will fill in the required particulars on cover page of the Test Booklet with Blue or Black ball point Pen only. But he/she will not open the Test Booklet until asked to do so by the invigilator.
- iii) Books, papers, slide rule, log table, paper, cellular phone, pager, calculator etc. are not allowed in the Examination Hall.
- iv) The examination will start exactly at the time mentioned in the 'Prospectus' and an announcement to this effect will be made by the Invigilator.
- v) During the examination the Invigilator will check 'Admit-Card' of the candidate and compare photographs to satisfy himself about the identity of each candidate. The Invigilator will also put his signature in the place provided in the Answer-Sheet.
- vi) The candidate shall bring his/her own ball pen or black point pen and HB pencil. These will not be supplied.
- vii) The candidate must use Ball Pen for answering on the OMR response sheet.
- viii) After completing the test and before handing over the Test Booklet and Answer-Sheet, the candidate should check again that all the particulars required in the Test Booklet and the Answer-Sheet have been correctly written.
- ix) A signal will be given at the beginning of the examination and at half time. A signal will also be given before the closing time when the candidates must stop marking responses.

- x) The candidate will be supplied OMR Answer-Sheet which will be evaluated by Computer and is to be used carefully. Complete and accurate marking on this sheet is, therefore, extremely important.
- xi)
 - a) To answer any question, the candidate will be required to darken the circle by using Ball Pen corresponding to the answer he/she thinks to be correct against the serial number of the question.
 - b) It should be carefully noted that the circles should be dark & be filled in as completely as possible.
- xii) No candidate will be allowed to enter in the examination hall fifteen minutes after the commencement of exam.
- xiii) The test-booklet and the OMR Answer sheet are to be handed over to the Supervisor/Invigilator before leaving the hall. The candidate who does not hand over the test-booklet alongwith the OMR Sheet to the Supervisor/Invigilator, his/her candidature will stand cancelled besides facing action to be decided by the University.
- xiv) The candidates are required to furnish the Admit Card at the time of (i) entry into the Examination Hall and (ii) during the course of examination for necessary identification by the supervisory staff on duty. The candidates are, therefore, advised to keep the Admit Card intact.
- xv) There will be no re-evaluation/re-checking of OMR Answer-Sheets.

10. PUNISHMENT FOR USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

If any candidate is found guilty of any breach of rules mentioned in the prospectus or guilty of using unfair means, he/she will be liable to be punished by the Competent Authority.

11. MEDICAL EXAMINATION

- (a) The selected candidates at the time of counselling (s) will report to the respective colleges for admission, medical examination and fee deposition on the dates fixed by the Counselling Board. The standard of physical fitness required for admission will be determined by the said board. The candidature of candidates found medically unfit will be liable to cancellation.
- (b) Selected physically handicapped candidates will also have to appear before the Medical Board for assessment whether they are fit to carry out the duties despite being handicapped. The decision of the Board will be final.

12. LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of examination and allotment shall fall within the jurisdiction of Rohtak only. The competent authority shall be the legal entity who may sue and be sued.

If any person (s) or officer(s) dealing with the conduct of MBBS/BDS/BAMS Entrance Examination engage himself/herself in act(s) that would result in the leakage of the question paper(s) or attempt to use or help in the use of unfair means in this examination, he/she shall be liable for prosecution under the Indian Penal Code.

Further the candidates suffering from disorder of colour perception, if admitted by merit, would be granted admission after appropriate counselling.

The criteria of deciding disorder of colour perception to be safe will be level CP.3 as per Defence letter which is given below:-

- Must recognize correctly white, signal red and signal green lights with Martin Lantern at 152 cm (5 feet).

3% horizontal reservation to Ex-servicemen/freedom fighters and their dependents (Code-5) by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of general category, 1% out of scheduled castes and 1% from backward classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Government and Government aided colleges/institutes located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes categories is concerned, year-wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if blocks A of scheduled castes and backward classes are given seats in the academic year 2007, the next block i.e. B Block of categories of scheduled castes and backward classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2008 as per letter no. 22/27/2004 -GS-III dated 20/10/2005 (Annexure-A-IV) and so on. The reservation policy is subject to revision/State Govt. decision and the same as applicable on the last date of submission of admission form shall be followed. The seats to ESM category candidates will be given as per priority laid down as per instructions issued by the Govt. of India Ministry of Defence Kendriya Sainik Board, New Delhi vide their letter No. 192/KSB/17F-11/2004-2005/c dated 18 May, 2004 as under :

Weightage to Sportsmen/Sportswomen

This weightage shall be given on the marks obtained by the candidates in the Entrance Examination and not in the Maximum Marks. Such marks will be indicated separately in the merit list.

No seats are reserved for candidates who have distinguished themselves in sports. However, such candidates who are otherwise eligible for admission to MBBS/BDS/BAMS Entrance Examination on the basis of marks secured in the qualifying examination will be given upto 5% weightage on a graded scale as given below for participation in sports/athletics during and after 11th class of Senior Secondary Certificate Examination.

Candidates claiming such weightage should submit Certificate issued by the Director of Sports of the State concerned stating grade and period of participation. Certificate from any other source will not be accepted.

- Note :
1. The reservation policy is subject to revision/State Government decision and the same as applicable on the last date of submission of admission form shall be followed.
 2. All candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes etc. must submit a certificate from the competent authority showing that they belong to these classes/castes, as given in Appendix-D. Castes Certificates as well as other should be only in the proformae and issued by the competent authority as prescribed by Haryana Govt. vide letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004. Certificates issued by other than the prescribed authority shall not be accepted.

3. As per Haryana Govt. Letter No. 18/238-2006 UNP-IV dated 9.11.2006 there would be no distinction between SC-A & SC-B category and 20% seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Caste candidates.(Annexure-A-III)
4. If the seats from BC Block-A are not filled up, these may be filled from BC Block-B and vice-versa.
5. List of Backward Classes notified by the State Govt. vide circular No.../1883-SW, (1) dated 28.9.95 is available at Appendix-J and also circular No. 1170-SW(1)-95 dated 7.6.95 for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (creamy layer) from Backward Classes is available at (Appendix-K) and clarification regarding issuance of certificate to Haryana Backward Classes given by the Haryana Govt. vide Letter No. 22.36/2000-3G.S. III dated 9th August, 2000 is at Appendix-L.
6. Children or Grand-Children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters who wish to be considered for reservation as such must submit a certificate from the Competent Authority (Appendix-H) alongwith an Affidavit (Appendix-I).
7. Only candidates having locomotor disability of lower limbs between 50 to 70% but otherwise medically fit for admission to the course will be considered for admission as physically handicapped (Certificate as in Appendix-F). Disability certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board. The decision of the Medical Board shall be Final.
8. Children/Wards of Military personnel (including personnel of para-military Forces) killed in action or permanently disabled in action and boarded out from the services or Ex-servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation as Ex-servicemen and their wards (Appendix-G).
9. A candidate who applies either for reserved category or for both reserved and open categories will be considered first in open category. In case he is not selected in open category, he will be considered for reserved category. **In case a candidate does not fill up his General or Reserve category in the OMR sheet and is, consequently not considered for admission against that category irrespective of the fact that he had claimed the same in his application form, he/she will not be subsequently considered for admission against that category.**
10. Competition for reserved seats will be amongst the candidates belonging to the categories for which the seats have been reserved. Reserved seats remaining vacant on account of non-availability of eligible candidates would be placed under 'Open Merit' seats.
11. A candidate who applies for and qualifies for admission in more than one reserved category will be asked to exercise his choice at the time of counselling. Institutional preference which the candidate exercised at the time of counselling will be considered final.

CHAPTER-VIII

METHOD OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION

Result :

1. An intimation regarding declaration of result of Entrance Examination will appear in the leading Newspapers.
2. Result of Entrance Examination will be intimated to the candidates individually by U.P.C. post. It will also be available in the office of concerned Colleges/Institutes and Controller of Examination M.D. University, Rohtak.

Counselling

1. The Counselling for Admission to MBBS/BDS/BAMS Courses will be held at Pt. B.D. Sharma P.G.I.M.S., Rohtak.
2. The date and time of Counselling (s) will be notified separately by Director, Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak
3. Apart from the Entrance Test, which the candidates will be required to take, the selected candidates will also be required to appear before the Counselling Board to be appointed by the Competent Authority. No relaxation will be given to candidates who are unable to appear before the Counselling Board on the fixed dates.

Note:- If two or more candidates secure identical marks in the entrance test, their relative merit will be determined by the total marks obtained by them in 10+2 examination. In case the marks in 10+2 examination are also identical, the candidate older in age will be preferred.

METHOD OF ADMISSION

- 1) At the time of counselling the candidates will be required to exercise their choice for the institution and the course. The allotment of the seats shall be made according to the merit and preference exercised by the candidates at the time of Counselling. Option once exercised shall be final. If a candidate does not get institution/course of his/her choice, he/she may opt to be wait-listed. **If a candidate opts for a course and institution before the Counselling Board and fails to join the concerned course/college, his/her candidature will stand cancelled and such candidate will not be allowed to exercise his/her option at the next counselling even if he/she had been wait listed for some course/college.**
- 2) **During subsequent counselling (s) the Course /Institution will be as per availability of the seat and merit of the candidate on that particular day.**
- 3) **Candidates who fail to attend the Medical Examination on the notified date(s) will forfeit the claim for admission and placement in the waiting list.**
- 4) On the failure of the selected candidates to report for admission, the vacancies caused would be filled at the time of next counselling by candidates from the waiting list in order of merit.
- 5) As decided by the Medical Council of India in terms of decision of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the admission in all the MBBS/BDS Institutions will be completed by 30th September of the year of the admission.

- 6) The name of the student(s) who remain(s) absent from classes for more than 15 days at a stretch will be struck off from the college rolls without giving any notice.
- 7) A candidate, who qualifies for the same course in both the entrance examination conducted by the CBSE on All India basis and conducted by the Competent Authority, Govt. of Haryana, will be considered against the CBSE seat in the course concerned. For example, if a candidate qualifies for admission to MBBS Course in Pt. B.D.Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak against CBSE seat and also qualifies the entrance examination conducted by the Competent Authority for admission to MBBS Course in this College, such a candidate will be considered against CBSE seat. Further, if a candidate is selected for BDS Course in Dental College, Rohtak in the entrance examination conducted by the CBSE on All India Basis and also qualifies the Entrance Examination conducted by the Competent Authority for admission to MBBS Course in the Pt. B.D.Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak, he will have his claim for admission to MBBS Course in Pt. B.D.Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak.

If any scholarship is to be given to the candidate by M.D. University, Rohtak who stands First in the Entrance Examination of M.D. University, Rohtak and granted admission against the C.B.S.E. seat, he will be eligible for the said scholarship.

CHAPTER-IX
GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Application for admission to Entrance Examination, duly complete in all respects must be accompanied by the following :-
 - a) Four copies of the recent photograph (passport size) duly attested by the Principal of the School/ College last attended.
 - b) Self Attested copies of certificates of sportsmanship (if claiming weightage for sports) issued by the Director of Sports of the concerned State giving grade and period of participation.
 - c) Self Attested copy of Matriculation/ Secondary School certificate (or its equivalent) showing the date of birth of the candidate.
 - d) Original Certificates pertaining to the following :
 - i) having studied in Haryana in class XI and class XII from the institution last attended as per proforma in Appendix- 'B'.
 - ii) Service Certificate from the employer as in Appendix 'D'.
 - iii) Certificate in the proforma in Appendix 'E' (in case of employees of Indian Defence Service/ Para-military Force belonging to Haryana).
 - iv) Certificate in the proforma in Appendix 'M' (in case of ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/Para-Military Force belonging to Haryana).
 - e) Self Attested copies of the following certificates :-
 - i) having passed/appeared in qualifying examination i.e. 10+2.
 - ii) Certificate of good conduct/character from the Principal of the Institution last attended.
 - iii) Certificate pertaining to claims for reservations (if claimed) Scheduled Castes (Appendix-D), Backward Classes (Appendix-D), Physically Handicapped (Appendix-F), Children of deceased/disabled/Ex-servicemen (Appendix-G) and children or Grand Children (Maternal/ Paternal) of Freedom Fighters (Appendix-H) and Affidavit-I.

NOTE :-

1. Certificates issued in the proforma prescribed by the competent authority mentioned in that will only be accepted.
- (A) A copy of the Prospectus containing an application form, OMR application form and other details for Entrance Examination can be obtained from the office of the Incharge, Publications Cell, M.D. University, Rohtak-124001 in person on payment of Rs. 1000/- (Rs. 250/- for SC/BC candidates of Haryana only) in cash. Request for Prospectus through registered post must be received in the office of the Incharge (Publications) on or before 13-05-2007 by sending a Bank Draft of Rs. 1050/- (Rs. 300/- for SC/BC candidates of Haryana only) drawn in favour of the Finance Officer, M.D. University, Rohtak payable at State Bank of India, M.D. University, Rohtak (Code 4734), failing which the request will not be entertained. Payment by the Cheque, Money Order, I.P.O. or in any other form will not be accepted.

Prospectus and application form can also be downloaded from University Website www.mdurohtak.com and should be accompanied with a bank draft drawn in favour of Finance

Officer, M.D. University, Rohtak payable at Rohtak for Rs. 1000/- (Rs. 250/- for SC/BC candidates of Haryana only).

2. Each candidate for the MBBS/BDS/BAMS Entrance Examination must fill up the Admission Form in his/her own handwriting and OMR Application Form as per instructions attached with it mentioning the category and send it under registered cover superscribed 'ADMISSION FORM FOR THE MBBS/BDS/BAMS ENTRANCE EXAMINATION-2007' to the Deputy Registrar (Re-evaluation), M.D. University, Rohtak or submit it personally and take a receipt thereof so as to reach M.D. University, Rohtak on or before 21-05-2007 upto 5.00 p.m.
3. The admission form duly complete in all respects must be sent through Registered/Speed Post. The authorities do not take any responsibilities for delay or loss of form or correspondence pertaining thereto in postal transit or through courier service.
4. The application form will not be returned.
5. All the particulars in the application form must be written carefully and legibly.
Applications which are incomplete in required particulars or enclosures will not be considered.
- 6. The cost of Application form/Prospectus inclusive of entrance examination fee will not be refunded in any case.**
7. Any attempt on the part of a candidate, his friends or relatives to canvass or bring influence to bear upon the Competent Authority directly or indirectly for securing admission will be disqualification for admission.
8. The candidates placed in the merit list provisionally must produce the following documents in original alongwith their attested copies at the time of counselling :-
 - a) Certificate of good conduct and character from the Principal/Head of the College/School last attended by the candidate.
 - b) A certificate of having passed the qualifying examination as mentioned under the Chapter relating to the Eligibility.
 - c) Matriculation/ Secondary School (or its equivalent) certificate/showing the date of birth of the candidate.
 - d) Certificates pertaining to claims for reservations (if claimed) Scheduled Castes (Appendix-C); Backward Classes (Appendix-D); Physically Handicapped (Appendix-F); Children of deceased/disabled/Ex-servicemen (Appendix-G) and Children or Grand Children (Maternal/ Paternal) of Freedom Fighters (Appendix-H) and Affidavit (Appendix-I).

Note :

All the selected candidates shall be required to deposit above original certificates (a to d) with the institution where they get admission. These will be returned after completion of the course. However, if a candidate withdraws his/her candidature then these will be returned immediately after that.

9. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him but at any subsequent time it is discovered that any portion of his information is incorrect or false he shall be removed from the college and fee and other dues paid upto the date of such removal shall be forfeited. The Competent Authority may take any further action against the student and his guardian as is considered necessary.

10. The Counselling Board shall have the power to call for any document(s) from the candidate(s) in support of his/her claim and reject any certificate not considered valid. The decision of the Counselling Board in this regard shall be final.
11. No judicial proceeding will lie against the Competent Authorities i.e. M.D. University, Rohtak for conducting test & declaring result and Director PGIMS, Rohtak for counselling & admissions.
12. All admissions to the MBBS/BDS/BAMS Entrance Examination and of such students as are admitted on the basis of MBBS/BDS/BAMS Entrance Examination are provisional i.e. subject to their registration with the M.D. University, Rohtak, or Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra as the case may be, after completing necessary requirements as per rules/ordinances.
13. The candidate will deposit the fees prescribed by the Institute/College within the period stipulated by the Director/Principal of the Institute/College, where the candidate has been admitted.
14. All admissions shall be made strictly on merit determined on the basis of performance in entrance examination.
- 15. The candidates already admitted in any Medical/Dental/Ayurvedic will not be considered eligible for admission to MBBS/BDS/ BAMS Course.**
16. In case of ambiguity in the rules, interpretation of the same by the Competent Authority shall be final.
17. Application forms received after the due date and time due to any reason including postal delay will be rejected without any intimation to the candidates.
18. All certificates on the basis of which reservation is being sought will have to be appended with the application form for admission to the course. No claim made at a later stage shall be entertained.
19. No change in category(ies) will be entertained/permitted at the later stage. However, the candidate who has once appeared in the Entrance Test/admitted against the general category seat shall not be shifted to reserved category seat at later stage.
20. The selection for admission will be cancelled if the selected candidate does not join the college/ Institute on the stipulated date fixed by the counselling board.
21. The fee deposited by any of the candidate in the college against Ist admission shall have to be refunded as per rules to the candidate by the college in case he/she is shifted/adjusted in any other course/college.
22. There shall be no re-evaluation/re-checking of Answer-sheet and no request in this regard shall be entertained.
23. A candidate who applies either for reserved category or for both reserved and open categories will be considered first in Open Category. In case he is not selected in Open Category, he will be considered for reserved category. **In case a candidate does not fill up his General or Reserve category in the OMR sheet and is, consequently not considered for admission against that category irrespective of the fact that he had claimed the same in his application form, he/she will not be subsequently considered for admission against that category.**
24. Competition for reserved seats will be amongst the candidates belonging to the categories for which the seats have been reserved. Reserved seats remaining vacant on account of non-availability of eligible candidates would be placed under 'Open Merit' seats.

25. A candidate who applies for and qualifies for admission in more than one reserved category will be asked to exercise his choice at the time of counselling. Institutional preference which the candidate exercised at the time of counselling will be considered final.
26. If any candidate or his/her parents or guardian are found to have submitted any false affidavit / certificate, not only the candidate's admission will be cancelled but the person filing the affidavit will also be liable to be prosecuted in accordance with law.
27. The categories of candidates who are entitled for nomination against the seats reserved for the nominee of Govt. of India and authorities to whom the applications for their nomination are to be sent by such candidates have been given Appendix- 'A'.
28. No foreign student shall be admitted to MBBS/BDS/BAMS course whether provisionally or on firm basis unless in case of seats made available, he/she has been sponsored by the respective Ministry/Department of the Govt. of India.
29. The rules given herein are only provisional. These may be changed or modified by the Competent Authority without prior notice. Candidates can not make any claim on the basis of information given in the prospectus.

BAN ON RAGGING IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Instructions for curbing ragging :

Ragging in educational institutions is banned and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately, which punishment may include expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. The punishment may also take shape of (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits (ii) debarring from representation in events (iii) withholding results (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess, and the like. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

The Following will be termed as the Act of Ragging :

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other students, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in freshers or junior students or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely effect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Note :

Besides above, the candidates would also observe the following instructions :-

- i) It must be noted by the candidates/parents/guardian etc. that ragging is banned in the institutions and in case anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately including expulsion from the Institution and/or imprisonment upto 3 years, and /or fine upto 25,000/-.
- ii) The concerned Institution will have the right that to prevent/prohibition of ragging under Act/Ordinance and if any, candidate admitted to the course found indulging in ragging will be cognizable offence and really means business and the Institutes will not hesitate to take stern action against the offenders.

- iii) A candidate admitted to the course in an Institution shall submit an undertaking duly signed by him/her and countersigned by his/her parents/guardian at the time of admission to the effect that he/she is fully aware of the law regarding ragging as well as the punishment and that he/she if found guilty on this account is liable to be punished appropriately. Similar undertaking shall also be furnished by the parents/guardian that they are fully aware and noted the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/her ward in case their ward, if admitted to the course is found guilty of ragging.
- iv) Undertaking of similar nature as given under Sr. No. iii & above shall also be obtained from the admitted candidates in the application form for admission to the Hostels as well.
